Smt. Sonali Mohapatra is an accomplished Odissi dancer known for her mastery in Abhinaya (expression) and Nritta (pure dance). She lost major portion of her hearing at the age of five, yet with strong willpower and passion, she embraced Odissi dance from childhood. She began her training at age four under Guru Smt. Truptimayee Mohanty and later refined her skills under Guru Shri Durga Charan Ranbir. With deep dedication and her family's support, she emerged as a leading dancer of the Guru Deba Prasad Das gharana. Her institution, Nrutya Upasana Pitha, is her proud creation, where she teaches Odissi and also takes the noble initiative of training differently-abled children.

Hanuman Chalisa is a sacred hymn composed by Saint Tulsidas, celebrating the devotion, strength, and purity of Lord Hanuman. This dance presentation pays tribute to the mighty Vanara who embodies Bhakti (devotion), Shakti (strength), and Seva (service). *Music: Guru Sri Abhiram Nanda, Dance Composition: Guru Smt. Saranga Pallavi is a pure dance piece where movement and music unfold gracefully like a blossoming flower. Dr. Ananda Shankar Jayant is one of India's most distinguished classical dancers, choreographers, and dance scholars. Honoured with the Padma Shri (2007) and the Sangeet Natak Akademi Puraskar (2009), she has made remarkable contributions to Bharatanatyam. Her digital creation Kutty Kahani—a video-embedded e-book for children—was acknowledged by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in his Mann Ki Baat (18 June 2023). A senior officer of the Indian Railway Traffic Service, she also leads Shankarananda Kalakshetra, founded in 1979, which has grown into a premier national institution dedicated to classical arts and creative excellence for over four decades.

DASHAVATARAM: Takkuvemi Manaku- A beautiful song in simple Telugu by Bhakta Ramadas of the 17 th century that goes on to describe the Dashavatara of Mahavishnu. Just as Krishna or Keshava is the central Bhagawan in Jayadeva's Dashavatara Ashtapadi, in this song by Bhakta Ramadas Sri Rama is the central God.

DEVI UPASAKAM: The worship and adoration of the Mother Goddess, reveals the secret of rising from darkness, untruth and mortality unto the grand realm of light, truth and life. She is the eternal Shakti, She is fearless, the Warrior, She is the defender, protector and saviour.

SHIVOHAM: Through the idiom of poetry, verse, melody and rhythm of timeless music, the architectonic beauty and grammar of Bharatanatyam, this is an offering to bring the Omniscient, Omnipresent Lord Shiva. *Choreography: Dr. Ananda Shankar Jayant*

Over three decades, SSD has expanded its artistic vision and now hosts four unique annual festivals conceptualized by its founder. Vyjayanthi Kashi, a dynamic force in Kuchipudi, has excelled as a performer, choreographer, teacher, researcher, and organizer. She has served as Chairperson of the Karnataka Sangeeta Nritya Academy, been a member of the Central Sangeet Natak Akademi, and is the creator of Dancejathre, India's first international dance fair. She is also a recipient of the Central Sangeet Natak Akademi Award.



Here art is not merely studied but lived. Each performance tradition preserved here serves as a living link to Kerala's rich cultural and mythological past. The institution makes classical forms meet contemporary expression without compromising authenticity. By fostering pride in Kerala's cultural identity, Kalamandalam strengthens social cohesion and collective heritage.

Duryodhana Vadha by Vayaskara Aryan Narayanan Moosad (1841-1902) is a Kathakali play that dramatizes pivotal moments from the Mahabharata, tracing the rise of Duryodhana's arrogance and his ultimate downfall. The play unfolds through the episodes of deceit, humiliation, exile, and vengeance that shape the moral and emotional landscape of the epic. Centering on the dice game, Draupadi's dishonour, Krishna's divine intervention, and the fierce fulfillment of Bhima's vow, the drama embodies the eternal conflict between adharma and dharma. Through expressive abhinaya, symbolic gesture, and stylized battle sequences, the play culminates in the annihilation of evil and the restoration of cosmic order. Leelakamal: This production is inspired by the traditional dances of Goshthaleela composed originally by the legendary maestro Guru Bipin Singh. Later it has been rechoreographed by Bimbavati Devi. Goshthaleela is traditionally performed in the temple premises on Gopasthami in the month of Kartik, in which Krishna and the sakhas go to the meadows to tame the cattle. Different valorous leelas of Krishna follow and eventually good triumphs over evil. Leelakamal has been blended with the ritualistic dance and music that are an essential part of the various Vaishnava performing traditions of Manipur. *Choreography & Direction: Bimbavati Devi*.

Charukeshi Pallavi beautifully blends footwork (Pada), rhythm (Laya), and graceful arrangement (Vinyasa), unfolding the elegance of the raga through coordinated movement and music. *Choreography: Guru Shri Bharat Charan Giri. Gajanana narrates the divine origin of Lord Ganesha—from Indra's arrogance and Durvasa's curse on Airavata to young Ganesha's encounter with Shiva, his beheading, and his revival with the head of a newborn elephant. 


